Mathematics at GMS

The GMS math curriculum asks students to think, communicate, and problem-solve, discovering connections between concepts through exploration rather than memorizing algorithms. Our curriculum, College Preparatory Math (www.cpm.org), emphasizes group work, asks students to develop understanding through multiple representations, and includes multiple ways to assess understanding. By the end of 8th grade all students complete a high school level Common Core Algebra I course.

Math Resident Teacher

This is a rich opportunity for someone interested in becoming a math teacher to gain experience while working with expert teachers. You will observe and teach classes, design curriculum and assessments, work one-on-one and in small groups with students, and participate in Math department activities. You will also participate in the greater community

of the school including substituting in classes across the curriculum, taking part in the advisory program, teaching elective and intersession courses, chaperoning field trips (day and overnight), and participating in faculty meetings and professional development.
