Dear GMS Community,

We started the 2019-20 school year with a remarkable event called *Dining with Empathy*. National champion slam poet, Andre Bradford, a.k.a. S.C. Says, joined our student body and a gym-full of parents, board members, and staff to share food and stories. The experience gave us an opportunity to celebrate shared values, build trust, and strengthen authentic relationships. Little did we know how valuable those connections would be in the coming months.

On Friday, March 13, 2020, life took a turn that would have been hard to imagine in January. For the safety of our community, we closed the school on Friday and began remote instruction the following Tuesday. On Wednesday, the county shelter-in-place order went into effect. Seemingly overnight, we found ourselves reimagining the concepts of school, work, and home. And still, as a community, we found connection, learning, and laughter.

GMS Teachers remain as committed as ever to engaging our students in meaningful learning. GMS Students have jumped into a new form of learning with earnestness and remarkable adaptability. GMS Parents are partnering with us to refine what it means to support students and families from afar. GMS Trustees are steadfast in their oversight of both the financial health of the school and meeting the ever-evolving needs of the community. GMS Alums are demonstrating long-term commitment and engagement in giving and volunteering. GMS Alum Families continue to contribute as volunteers and philanthropists to the GMS community after graduation. GMS Staff have become experts in video conferencing and public health. We must acknowledge the deep generosity of this community and how they came together — before and after this crisis. Together we:

- Raised \$2,492,420 for the school and celebrated another year of 100% philanthropic participation by our board, staff, and current families.
- Raised \$822,595 through The GMS Fund to provide the critical operational support that enriches the experience of every GMS student every day.
- Raised \$1,171,064 in major gifts and contributions to the Bennett Scholars Program, even after canceling our much anticipated Bennett Scholars Breakfast.
- Supported 26% of our student body with financial assistance including 28 Bennett Scholars, to ensure that a GMS education remains accessible to families.

The pages of this annual report are filled with photos from the first three-quarters of our school year. Seeing our students running across the turf together fills me with joy, hope, and resolve. I invite you to celebrate this community with me and reflect on our shared experience and strength.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT SOLUTION STORYBOARDING WITH COMPUTER SCIENCE TEACHER KYLIE JUE

Sixth-grade Computer Science teacher Kylie Jue brought her experiences leading a remote GMS classroom to Stanford University this spring as she prepared to receive her Masters in Human-Computer Interaction.

Realizing that student voices were missing from the conversation about remote learning, Kylie and her two Stanford classmates wanted to explore the questions: *How are students handling the remote learning platforms that shelter-in-place necessitates? Which features of the technology and interactions are working for them? Which aren't?*

To answer these questions, Kylie turned to her 60 GMS sixth graders. For their culminating computer science project, sixth graders were asked to explore the challenges their classmates faced during remote learning and invent a tool to improve their online school experience. Kylie describes the project's aim "to empower the students and show them that they have the capacity to change technology and influence the development of the tools they are using."

Over the course of three 40-minute remote class periods, students used the co-design principles of Empathize, Imagine, Create (see box below) to create a prototype of a remote learning platform. From streamlined assignment lists to solutions for

EMPATHIZE

They explore and identify commonalities of their experiences and brainstorm ways to solve common pain points.



CREATE

They create a prototype of a new (or improved) learning platform. Using media of their choice, they tell the story of someone using their proposed concept. Student groups use a variety of methods from Scratch, Wix, Canva, Unfold Studio, and Google Slides — and present their projects to the entire grade.

time-management and working offline when wireless fails, our sixth grade computer scientists impressed Kylie with the depth and sophistication with which they tackled the project. They were addressing problems and frustrations they were grappling with every day — so the solutions were personal and precise.

Some of those frustrations Kylie and her students were able to solve with other creative solutions. Kylie explains how in the first weeks of shelter-in-place, it was a struggle to communicate with many students across many platforms.

Working together, Kylie and her students transitioned to remote group work that was more reflective of their in-person collaborative learning style.

Every class began with an invitation for students to find their in-person table groups online and figure out the day's challenges together. This collaborative approach to solving the challenges of remote learning provided a natural segue to their final project.

Kylie and her classmates presented the GMS students' final projects to their class at Stanford and have connected with the Google Classroom team to share their findings. Meanwhile, Kylie is focused on continuing to build equity and agility into remote learning models. She is ready to continue working collaboratively with other GMS teachers and classes to find ways to partner and change technology and our use of it to meet our student needs.

FACULTY PERSPECTIVE Andi Barlas, Director of Social Emotional Learning

As I look back on the last months of the 2019-20 school year, I recall my first thoughts, "what a daunting undertaking." It was too easy to focus on what was missing: my students, their faces, their laughter, and their banter.

When schools closed, we all initially assumed that the shelter-in-place would be for a few weeks, but that clearly changed. What I appreciated was that from day one, the focus the teachers had was to continue with the curriculum, not just pass the time until things resumed back to normal.

The teachers offered a much needed shelter within the school community during such uncertain times.

I believe the students learned from their teachers and advisors to adapt quickly and be fully functional. This unique experience offered an opportunity to grow and learn (albeit sometimes different lessons than those that were originally planned). My daughter, Yasmine, along with her classmates, learned firsthand to be resilient, flexible, empathetic, and most importantly to rise to the occasion during challenging times. Such a valuable perspective for when they become women.

When I think of GMS, I think of a place where girls thrive under any situation, a place where they are taught to make it work and rise to challenges. Everyone should feel really proud that they embodied that spirit and passed it on to some very fortunate girls.

Questions from the Heart

TALKING IT OUT AN IMPROMPTU SUMMER CAMP FOCUSED ON CONVERSATIONS ABOUT RACE, CREATED BY JOY XU, 8TH GRADE HUMANATIES TEACHER

What inspired you to create a camp about antiracism?

At the end of the school year, when the most recent Black Lives Matter protest was beginning, I was struck by how many students were craving space to grapple with the emotions of what was happening. I created the camp as a way for the students and me to consider big questions and build a deeper understanding of concepts like systemic racism, privilege, and antiracist allyship.

I named the camp after the book *Courageous Conversations About Race* by Glenn Singleton who has done tremendous work with social equity in schools.

Did anything surprise you about the experience?

I was surprised by how much exposure the students already had with the concepts in the camp and how aware they were about the Black Lives Movement and what it means to be an ally. We began our work in a different place than I expected because so many of them had already started having these conversations with each other, friends, and their families.

What have you taken away from the experience of these conversations?

What is striking about working with the students through this is the amount of vulnerability and courage it takes to approach these questions from the heart. It's hard to share personal stories of race and privilege, sit with discomfort and build understanding. I keep asking myself, how can we help ourselves and our students build understanding so we have the conviction and knowledge to take action?

Looking ahead to the 2020-2021 school year, what is something you are committed to focusing on?

I want to make sure every student feels safe and a part of the community at all times next year. When we had to switch to remote learning this spring, I missed the everyday interactions with students that aren't focused on curriculum. We want to find connections that build the trust and groundwork for us to move from understanding facts to relational knowledge in the classroom.

What is it about the GMS Spirit that helps us adapt to thrive during challenging times?

Part of the GMS Spirit is this attitude of taking stock of a situation, rolling up our sleeves, and getting to work. I often tell my students that we are doing the best we can with what we've got. There is also a deep kindness in the community. Those moments of small kindnesses with each other go a long way to help everyone through.

» Worked with the Student Council to celebrate the faculty and staff through a live assembly with art, videos, and speeches.

FAMILY SPOTLIGHT A Conversation with **Barbara Schneider**, Board of Trustee and Parent '15 '17

What is your hope for next year or what is top of mind as you consider the fall?

My heart goes out to the sixth graders and their families as I remember my own daughters' experience. And I have every confidence that our school will successfully welcome them into the GMS culture and community with creativity and warmth.

I want us to consider all the needs of our families, faculty, and staff — emotional, physical, intellectual, social. Just as in an average year that is jam-packed with labors of love from the faculty and staff, I am filled with appreciation and I want to be sure everyone feels the full support of the board.




